

# NOTES from the CHAIRMAN

On Christmas Day, 1864, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow wrote the words to a poem, later to become a beloved Christmas song entitled I Heard the Bells On Christmas Day. This poem described his despair and hopelessness in the dark days of the American Civil War and personal tragedy in his family. But in the midst of his despair, he kept hearing the pealing of the church bells on Christmas Day, reminding Longfellow of the hope that Christ brings. The last verse proclaims - "Then winging, singing on its way, the world revolved from night to day. A voice, a chime, a chant sublime of peace on earth, goodwill to man". For 25 years, the Greer Christian Learning Center has been the 'pealing bell" for thousands of young people in the Greer and Blue Ridge areas. During dark times of despair that plagues the life of many of these students, the hope of Christ is offered fervently through the teaching and care of the staff and volunteers. January 2022 will mark the 25th anniversary of the founding of the Greer Christian Learning Center.

### BRCLC Bible 101 Class Studies The Life Of Jesus

Bible 101 (Bible Basics) classes are currently studying the life of Jesus. The class began with the story of Jesus' humble birth and the beginning of His ministry. We studied the 7 Signs of John, why Jesus needed to perform miracles — proving the miracles happened — and what God was revealing. We then ventured into 6 specific parables and dissected each one verse by verse.

Bible 101 not only studied the reasoning behind Jesus overturning the tables in the temple, but the significance of the last supper and the meaning of the bread and wine as well. We also examined the crucifixion and resurrection and what those events mean for our faith. We discussed how we, as Christians, can prove these events happened and face any arguments that could arise when discussing this with nonbelievers.

After Thanksgiving break, students will go through an important relationship series while discussing Godly dating, relationships, and the covenant of marriage.

Once the relationship series concludes, students will begin a series on anxiety, based off a RightNow Media study.

#### Different World Religions Are Discovered In Bible 102

Different world religions — and how they differ from Christianity — was the topic for Bible 102 (Biblical Life Applications) students. The class discussed how to have a conversation about Christ with someone of different faiths.

They also learned how to defend their

faith to other religions as well as handling tough conversations that could arise. We then studied many denominations of the Christian faith and their differences and similarities.

Also, Bible 102 students just concluded a series on Spiritual Disciplines: prayer, fasting, service, discipleship, Bible study and evangelism.

After Thanksgiving, students will study Apologetics from a RightNow Media lesson.


